Recap: 2018-19

- Initial representations to CBEC remained futile
 - o Members could not get any relief
- * MANSA Members advised by ELP to furnish a general draft for:
 - Replying to Service Tax Authorities on receipt of their queries / Notices
- Specific cases of threatening letters to ELP for
 - Submission to the Court seeking interim stay
- Senior Counsel Mr. Nankanni expressed
 - MANSA has good chances of getting positive result out of the Writ
- Several Writs filed by EXIM fraternity on this issue
 - Clubbed by the Court



- 24th Aug 2018: Writ Petition is listed for admission hearing before Division Bench arguments to be conducted
- 07th June 2019: Writ Petition has been admitted for hearing and awaiting further hearing and final verdict

Sea Cargo Manifest & Transport Regulations 2018

- MANSA raised issues with CBIC of problems of registration & accessing the system by Agents
 - MANSA continuously taking up the & clarifying technical/Legal issues related with SCMT
- ❖ MANSA raised & sorted out concerns through IPA at the root level related
 - o Breakbulk, RoRo, Bulk & Passenger vessels
- Issues faced by Shipping Lines & Agents as follows:
 - o Errors popped while registering related to
 - PAN No. & other Identification (PIN)
 - o During registration screen often became static with error 39 etc.
 - Hurdle for smooth working
 - No option to modify Parent User
 - Users registered as Shipping Line are not able to complete the registration process
 - Registration completed in one jurisdiction can't be utilized in other jurisdictions
 - Confusion among fraternity & stakeholders due to
 - Poor response from ICEGATE team & SCMT Help Desk
 - o Initial Date of Implementation: 1st Aug 2018
 - Implemented on 1st Aug 2019
- ❖ICEGATE /SCMT team made special presentation/workshop in Delhi for queries raised by MANSA

- Major Issues of members highlighted to Director (Customs), CBIC
 - Importation / Exportation of Vessels
 - Duty on Bunkers from last Indian Port of Call
 - Co-Loading
 - Bunker Sampling
 - Time taken for Assessment of Final Bill of Entry (B/E)
 - Indian manning including 15% mandatory to work in Indian waters (>30 days)
 - Freight Tax
- Issues were examined by the Board and after careful consideration,
 - CBIC decided to harmonise the procedures

Maritime Anti-Corruption Network Port Integrity Project (India)

❖ The Maritime Anti-Corruption Network (MACN):

- Established in the year 2011
- Working against corruption in the Maritime industry
- Vision To make maritime sector free of Corruption
- Enabling fair trade practices

Barriers in the Maritime Sector: Corruption is impending economic and social development & Driving up the Trade cost

MACN'S collective action approach :

- Dialogue with stakeholders :
 - o As they play a central role in the clearance of goods through maritime ports worldwide.
 - Customs, ports, immigration and quarantine authorities

Anti Corruption measures in India: GOI has introduced

- ➤ E-governance systems & new legislations in public authorities
- Demonetization targeting cash-centric black market

MACN's Incident Data – India

- > Over 400 incidents of corrupt demands were reported through MACN's reporting mechanism.
- Rejection to the demands could lead to :
 - Threats of delays & Violence

Proposal to Strengthen Integrity in Ports links well with priorities of GOI

- MACN has started pilot projects in India with help of MANSA
 - The first Port being Mumbai Port started from July 1, 2019
 - Consecutively, all major Ports shall be covered


