

Introduction & Commencement of Proceedings by Mr. C. S. Murty, Secretary General

Mr. C.S. Murty, Secretary General to begin the 43rd AGM with his below speech:

- a) Role of agent before and when vessel enters and exits the port.
- b) Responsibilities of agent while vessel is in port with probable risk exposure.
- c) General expectations/ legal status of an agent.

- e) Brief overview on "General Average".
